Project Purpose/Goal



The most recent Comp Plan update calls for OP to study strategies to **improve resident access** to the waterfront, Rock Creek Park and other **community amenities** in the Foggy Bottom/West End FPAA.

This project will serve as a first step by analyzing the public realm, focusing on non-automobile forms of mobility and identifying areas for intervention.



Project Scope



Pre-Launch Community Engagement: OP will convene community stakeholder groups to assess community concerns, goals, areas of contention and validate those concerns with other residents within the study area.

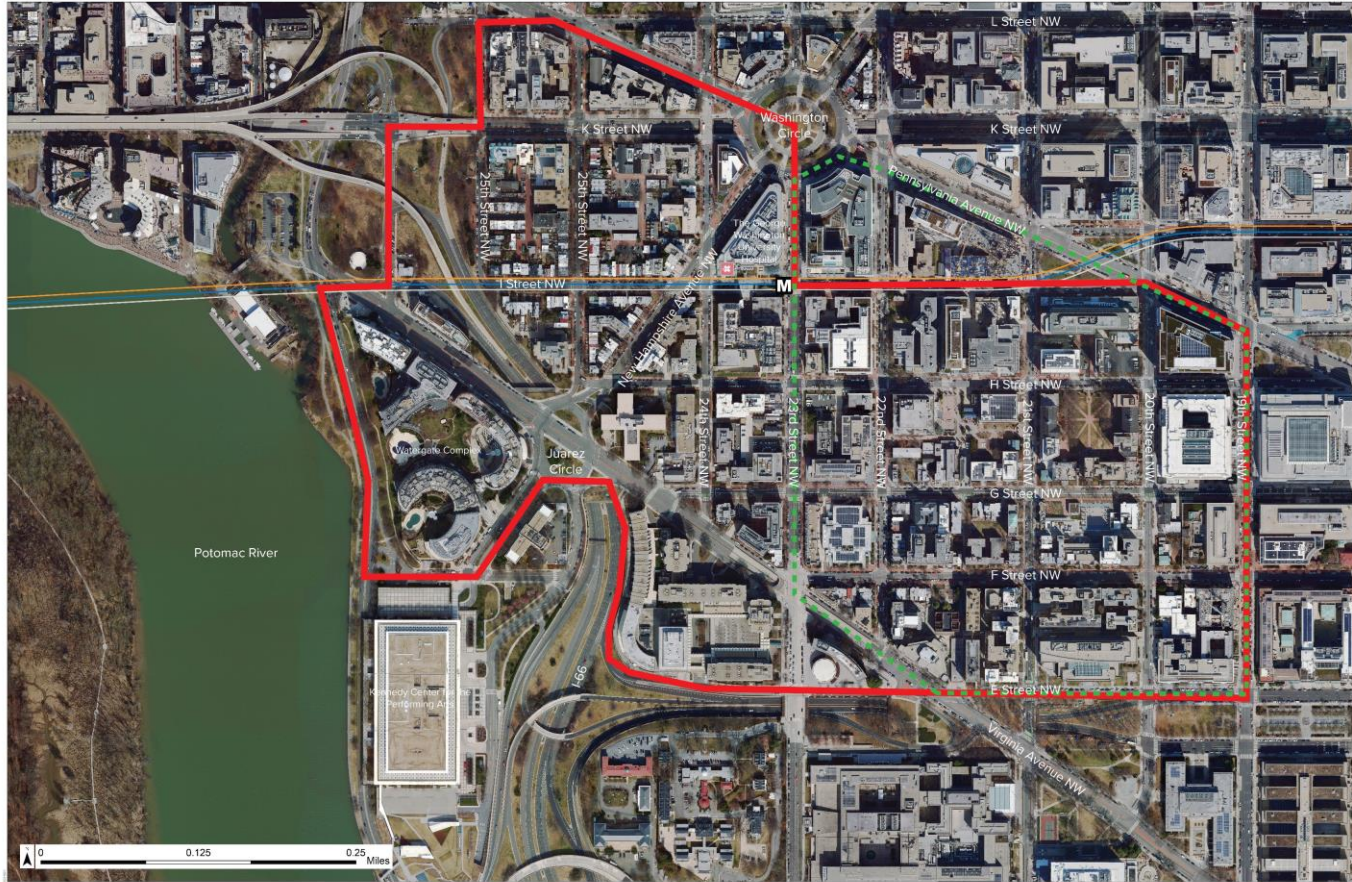
Proposed Public-Facing Tasks:

- 1. Background Review, Project Kick-off and Ongoing Management:** OP will work with Consultant to review the baseline existing conditions including updated demographics information, inventory of assets, transportation network, nodes, etc.
- 2. Public Space Analysis and Public Life Field Work:** OP and Consultant will observe important nodes to determine how space is currently used and what barriers to efficient movement exist
- 3. Recommendations Report:** OP and Consultant will develop recommended interventions categorized by complexity of implementation

- Councilmember Pinto has prioritized this planning project.
- NP joined two community walks with Civic associations in Feb
- NP conducted two additional May and June visits.

Project Boundary

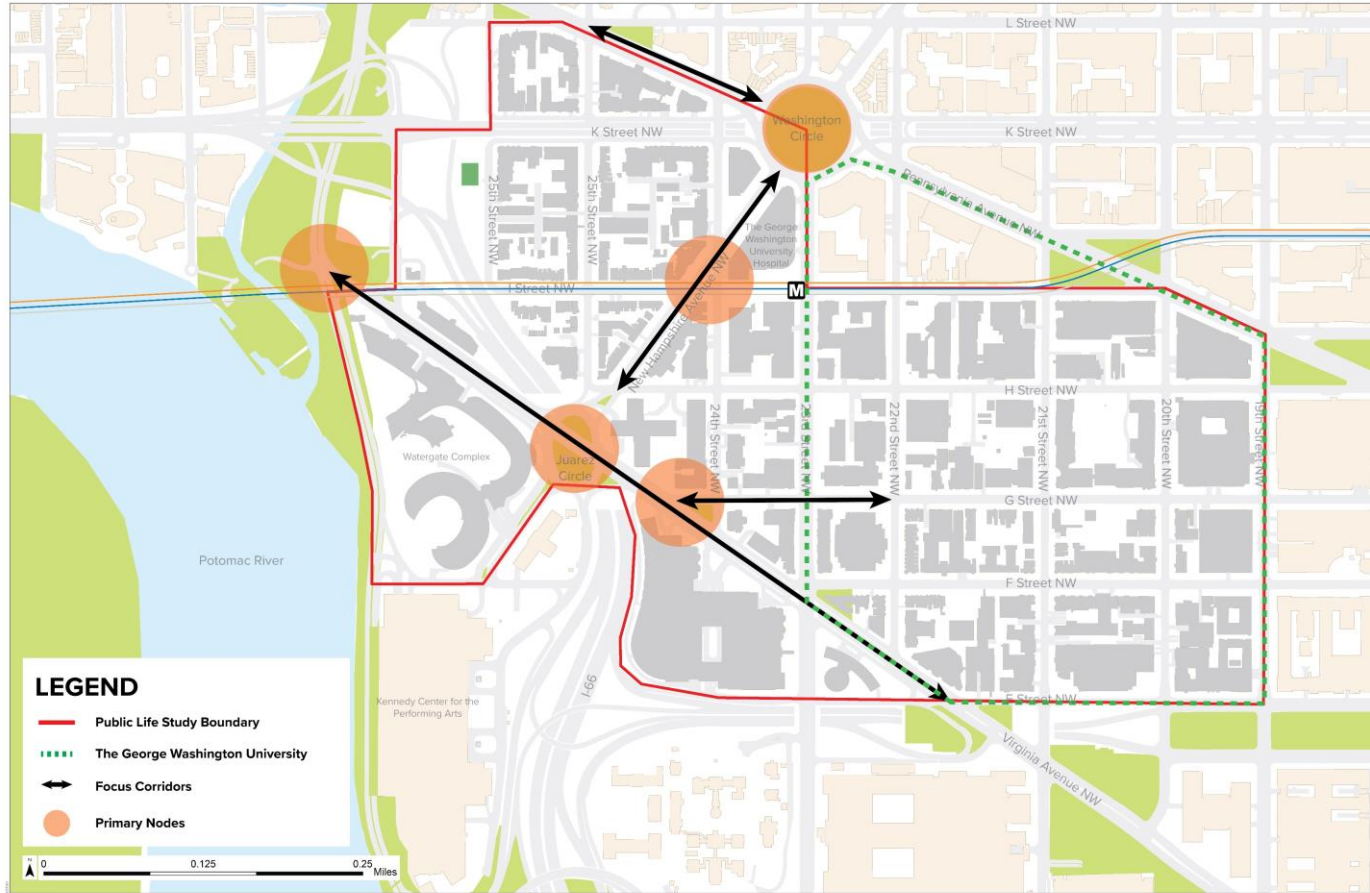


What is a Public Life Study?



Public life is about the everyday activities that people naturally take part in when they spend time with each other outside their homes, workplaces, and cars. Public life studies analyze observed human behavior in shared spaces to inform policy, regulations, and public space design.

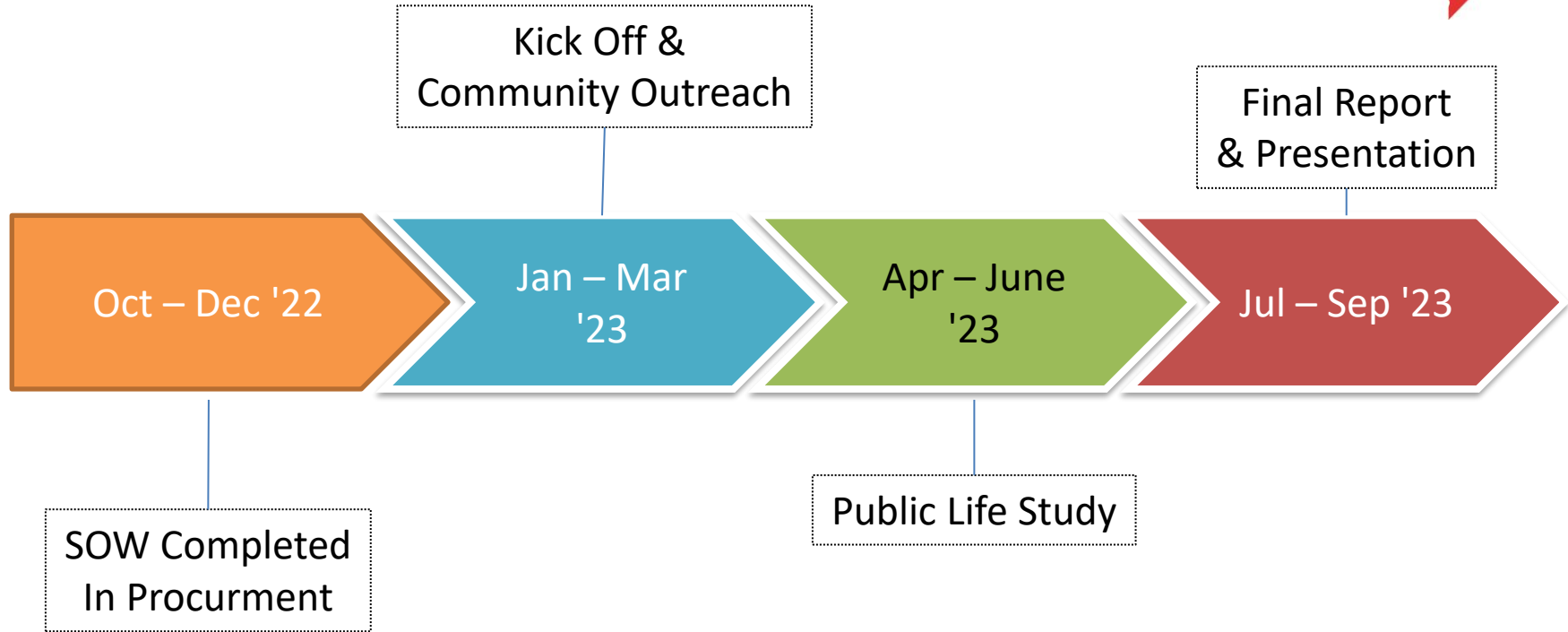
Potential Corridors
