RE: FY26 Budget Priorities for ANC 2A

Councilmember Pinto,

At its regular meeting on Wednesday, January 21st, 2026, Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2A (“ANC 2A” or “Commission”) considered the above-referenced matter. With five of five commissioners present, a quorum at a duly-noticed public meeting, the Commission, after a motion made by Commissioner Patel and seconded by Commissioner Youngstone, adopted the following resolution by (5-0-0):

While this list is not exhaustive, the following items should be prioritized in the FY26 budget:

- Utilize the Aston’s full capacity of 190 beds for individuals.
- Provide funding to hire additional full-time equivalent (FTE) staff at the Department of Human Services (DHS) and its contractor Friendship Place in FY26 to support the Aston as it reaches full capacity.
- Ensure that all outstanding issues related to Francis Field are addressed during this budget cycle, including matters under the purview of the Trust for the National Mall (TOJ), as applicable.
- Fund and complete necessary repairs to the tennis courts and basketball courts located on N Street, N.W.
- Ensure that all 311 service requests are addressed in a timely manner, including repairs that fall under the responsibility of DDOT and DGS.
- Sustain and enhance current funding levels for the Foggy Bottom–West End Village and the Foggy Bottom West End Main Street.
- Fund extended operating hours for the West End Library.
- Increase funding for additional DHS staff to ensure timely re-housing services for individuals experiencing homelessness.
