RE: DC Department of Transportation (DDOT) Oversight Performance 2026

At its regular meeting on Wednesday, February 25, 2026, Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2A (“ANC 2A” or “Commission”) considered the above-referenced matter. With five of six commissioners present, a quorum at a duly-noticed public meeting, the Commission, after a motion made by Chairperson Patel and seconded by Commissioner Malec, adopted the following resolution by (5-0-0):

WHEREAS, the DC Department of Transportation (DDOT) has the core responsibility to maintain the District’s transportation infrastructure in a state of good repair to ensure public health, safety, and the preservation of housing stock; and

WHEREAS, ANC 2A previously submitted multiple performance and budget oversight resolutions in Fiscal Year 2024 documenting persistent infrastructure, maintenance, and safety deficiencies throughout the Snows Court corridor; and

WHEREAS, over a four-year period, ANC 2A hosted multiple “Sidewalk Palooza” events so that residents could collectively submit 311 and Traffic Safety Investigation (TSI) requests addressing sidewalk conditions, traffic safety, and other infrastructure concerns within the commission; and

WHEREAS, despite these efforts and repeated prior oversight resolutions, timely maintenance of the Snows Court corridor has not been provided, placing residents and the residential housing stock at risk; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Pinto toured the Snows Court corridor and established the Snows Court Task Force in response to ANC 2A advocacy and resolutions, highlighting the urgency of addressing persistent cross-agency failures impacting the corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works (DPW) does not provide essential services to the Snows Court corridor that street-facing properties receive, including routine street sweeping, leaf collection, and snow surface treatment; and



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WHEREAS, timely execution, sustained maintenance, and coordinated agency responsibility remain essential to preserving housing stock and ensuring public safety along Snows Court;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that ANC 2A requests that the D.C. Council formally recognize the Snows Court corridor as a **residential alley**, ensuring that DDOT and sister agencies align service delivery and maintenance obligations with its residential use; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that ANC 2A requests that the D.C. Council provide full transparency, defined project scopes, and a public timeline for urgent and necessary maintenance projects affecting the corridor; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that ANC 2A urges DDOT to prioritize with urgency all outstanding service requests for infrastructure repair and sidewalk updates within the commission’s boundaries and ensure coordination with sister agencies to address longstanding maintenance gaps; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that ANC 2A reaffirms its prior resolutions on this matter — including **Resolution 2A-24-05 (FY2024 Performance Oversight of DDOT and Snows Court Corridor)** and **Resolution 2A-24-12 (Sidewalk and Infrastructure Maintenance Oversight)** — and emphasizes that continued inaction is inconsistent with citywide priorities to preserve residential housing stock and public safety.
