Re: Office of Attorney General Budget Performance Oversight Resolution 2026

At its regular meeting on Wednesday, April 15, 2026, Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2A (“ANC 2A” or “Commission”) considered the above-referenced matter. With six of six commissioners present, a quorum at a duly-noticed public meeting, the Commission, after a motion made by Chairperson Patel and seconded by Commissioner Youngstone, adopted the following resolution by (2-4-0):

WHEREAS, the mission of the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) is to enforce the laws of the District of Columbia, provide legal services to the District government, and independently and objectively pursue the public interest;

WHEREAS, the overall purpose of the Attorney General Act and the related amendments to the Home Rule Act was to elevate and strengthen the position of Attorney General, ensure the office’s independence, and significantly enhance the Attorney General’s ability to serve the interests of the District and its residents in an objective and independent fashion;

WHEREAS, at its regular meeting in June 2025, Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2A (“ANC 2A” or “Commission”) adopted a [resolution](#)¹ addressed to the Council of the District of Columbia’s Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety regarding the FY 2026 budget of the OAG;

WHEREAS, the Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia (“OAG”) is charged with protecting the legal interests of the District while independently enforcing laws that protect workers, consumers, tenants, and the public interest; and


THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2A strongly urges the Council of the District of Columbia to provide increased funding to the Office of the Attorney General, specifically for the expansion of its Consumer and Tenant Response Division and the Workers’ Rights and Anti-Fraud Section, so that they may continue to robustly advocate for District residents.
